Wizards Game Oct. 24 – Will need 7-8 key people for concessions. Texas Road House Fundraiser will be 10/07/18 Will do advertisement to help promote. Margie believes TRH will split the cost. Wendy reported that we made \$1090 at Cortland High School and over \$500 with the 50-50. The winner donated the winnings back. SUNY Cortland will be very similar in that we will be working in their stand but there is a lot of paperwork and we will have several fees. We will see how the first one goes and decide whether it is worth it or not.</p>

Trying to keep all activity other than games off varsity soccer field at high school. All coaches have been great with all the changes. Heat index has caused some rescheduling. Rumors going around that are not true. One was that all modified programs were ending. Larry thought this might have started with the hard time they have had getting a modified swim coach. The diving board is out of service so Dryden will not have diving meets at home. New one is possible. Homecoming is Oct 12th. Senior night for football and cheer will be that night too.
